



The Katharine Hepburn Cultural Arts Center Scholarship

To annually recognize a high school student residing in Old Saybrook who has demonstrated participation in and an appreciation for the arts (performance, visual, or literary arts).

The scholarship is presented by the Katharine Hepburn Cultural Arts Center (the Kate) in honor of its 12-time Oscar-nominated, four-time Oscar-winning namesake, Katharine Hepburn. One of Old Saybrook's most celebrated residents, Ms. Hepburn is known as one of America's most iconic actresses. In her youth, she was an avid athlete and fan of movies. During her time studying at Bryn Mawr College, she developed a love for acting and decided to pursue a theatrical career. With many Hollywood movies and roles on Broadway in her repertoire, she retired to Old Saybrook where she continued swimming and golfing, as well as painting. She was also very well-known for her baked goods.

This scholarship award honors Ms. Hepburn's diverse interests in the arts and her independent and spirited approach to life. ***The award is a \$1,000 scholarship to be used to further one's study in an area of interest at a college, trade school, or formal certificate program.*** One scholarship is awarded each year and will be presented at the recipient's school awards ceremony.

Eligibility:

- Resident of Old Saybrook, CT
- High school senior or equivalent

Application Checklist:

- Brief essay of no more than 500 words demonstrating participation in and an appreciation for the arts, including current activities
- Two letters of recommendation
- Interview with Scholarship Committee

Award recipient will be required to submit a brief written (email is allowable) progress report by the end of the calendar year.

Deadline to apply is April 10, 2020.
